Keep Yourself Safe

Situational Awareness - Situational awareness means knowing what's going on around you, understanding what it means, and anticipating what might happen next.

- Perception
 - Notice the key elements in your environment
 - People, objects, threats, changes
- Comprehension - understanding what those elements mean in context
- Projection - Anticipating how the situation will evolve in the near future

People Descriptions - be prepared to provide descriptions of a person(s) of interest

- Sex (male, female)
- Race/ethnicity
- Approximate age
- Height (estimate is fine)
- Weight/build (thin, average, muscular, heavy)
- Hair (color, length, style, texture)
- Eyes (color, shape if notable)
- Facial hair (beard, mustache, stubble)
- Skin tone
- Distinctive features (Scars, Tattoos, Birthmarks, Missing teeth, Glasses, Piercings)
- Clothing (headwear, shirt/top, jacket, pants/shorts/skirt/dress, shoes, accessories like purse, backpack, etc)
- Behavior/Movement (direction of travel, gait, mannerisms, speech)

Vehicle Descriptions - be prepared to provide descriptions of a vehicle(s) of interest

- Make, model, color
- License plate (even partial)
- Damage or unique markings
- Tinted windows, stickers, rims
- Direction of travel

Keep Yourself Safe

Scenario #1 (malls, major retail stores, gyms, grocery stores, parks)

Situation: You are in a store and you think someone is following or stalking you.

Solution:

- Verify you are being followed.
- If possible, be sure there are multiple people in any aisle or area you enter.
- Go to customer service or security and inform them you believe you are being followed and provide a description.

Scenario #2

Situation: You are going to your car in a parking lot and there is a car parked so close to your drivers door, you can't get in the car.

Solution:

- If there is a car parked on the passenger side as well, do not enter that space.
- Walk away from the vehicle to a safe spot and take a picture of both vehicles, including tags if possible.
- Return to the store, talk to management or security or call local law enforcement from within the store.

Scenario #3

Situation: You are driving your car and you believe you are being followed.

Solution:

- Verify you are being followed using the three right hand turn method:
 - Make the first right turn.
 - Make a second right turn. If the other car makes the second turn, it may be following.
 - Make a third right turn. If the other care makes the third turn, it is following you.
- Making note of the vehicle description, go to a local police department or fire department. If you see a police officer enroute, get their attention.
